## **Chairman's Report 2022**

The past year was a period of gradual recovery from covid related restrictions. We held the 2021 AGM and summer meeting at Nutley. Jack Cranfield gave a talk on his ongoing work on Tudeley and Roffey. The winter meeting in January 2022 was held by zoom. Kay Smith gave a talk on the manufacture of cannon revealing that it was a complex process with many stages involving much skilled work. Technical problems caused the talk to be divided into two parts and some participants were unable to log-on to the second of these. Kay willingly repeated her talk in April, this time without glitches.

An innovation this year was talks by zoom by Judie English, Tim Smith and Jeremy Hodgkinson on aspects of the iron and steel industry. Each attracted over 20 participants.

There was no spring visit in 2022. In its place WIRG participated in the Historical Metallurgy Society's experimental archaeology event at Cranborne in June.

The experimental bloomery continued in use with smelts each month from April to October, except in June when a wren nesting nearby caused a cancellation. An open day was held in August with six visitors.

Excavations continued in Great Park Wood on the Brede/Udimore border. A magnetometry survey conducted by the Hastings Area Archaeological Research Group indicated areas of possible industrial activity close to the area already under excavation.

Forays were conducted to Tudeley and Petley Wood, near Battle. The Tudeley foray visited the probable site of the only medieval bloomery whose accounts have survived. The foray to Petley Wood identified a previously unrecorded bloomery site close to a series of ore pits found by the Battle and District Historical Society in 1952.

We responded to a consultation by Hastings Museum about their expansion plans and commented on their display of iron firebacks and more generally on their treatment of the iron industry, an important element in the history of Hastings and its environs. We wrote to Wealden District Council in support of the submission of the County Archaeologist concerning a planning application relating to the site of Chiddingly furnace and forge.

Committee meetings in September 2021 and March and May 2022 were held in Nutley Hall. The December 2021 meeting was by zoom. My thanks to all members of the committee for their work in the past year and during the Covid pandemic, which I hope is now behind us.
